


# **Recalling the SDGs**

 Regardless of framework used, development goals and their targets are interlinked, forming a network of targets and activities



# The SDGs have effectively been described as a network of targets, (David Le Blanc 2015) which should facilitate an integrated approach to development



## **The Paris Agreement and the SDGs**

- Climate change maps to all the SDGs, in addition to the few targets listed under Goal 13, as well as the Africa Agenda 2063
- Some of the goals are guiding principles for designing effective adaptation, such as on gender, focus on vulnerable communities
- There is great potential by linking adaptation planning through the National Adaptation Plans, with the goals and targets in the climatesensitive sectors in the SDGs, as part of the broader national development agenda
- Implementation of adaptation would then contribute towards achievement of the SDG targets
- When countries report on their Nationally Determined Contributions to the Paris Agreement, their priorities and actions would reflect the coupling between development and adaptation

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



#### **Essential functions**

In its further guidance for and support of the process to formulate and implement NAPs, the LEG has clustered the activities that a country would undertake and support, into 10 essential functions

- The <u>essential functions</u> are being applied to:
  - Provide a basis to examine national adaptation capacity;
  - 2. Guide the development of monitoring and evaluation protocols for the NAP process to facilitate a successful process ("PEG M&E Tool"), to complement efforts aimed at monitoring and evaluation of adaptation (projects/programmes, as well as outcomes of such efforts in the long run)



#### **Listing of the Essential Functions of the NAP process (LEG, 2015)**

- 1. Helping governments to provide **national leadership** and **coordination of adaptation efforts at all levels** and to act as the **main interface** with regional and international mechanisms
- The collection, compilation, processing and dissemination of data, information and knowledge on climate change and relevant development aspects in support of adaptation planning and implementation
- 3. Identifying and addressing gaps and needs related to capacity for the successful design and implementation of adaptation
- 4. Assessing **climate-development linkages and needs**, and supporting the **integration** of climate change adaptation into national and subnational development and sectoral planning (through policies, projects and programmes)
- **5.** Analysing climate data and assessing vulnerabilities to climate change and identifying adaptation options at the sector, subnational, national and other appropriate levels



#### Listing of the Essential Functions of the NAP process (LEG, 2015), contd.


- 6. Appraising adaptation options to support decision-making on adaptation investment plans and development planning
- 7. Promoting and facilitating the **prioritization** of climate change adaptation in national planning
- 8. Facilitating the **implementation** of adaptation at all levels through appropriate policies, projects and programmes, taking into account opportunities for **synergy**
- 9. Facilitating the **monitoring**, **review** and **updating** of adaptation plans over time, to ensure progress and effectiveness of adaptation efforts and to demonstrate how gaps are being addressed
- 10. Coordinating **reporting** and **outreach** on the NAP process to stakeholders nationally, internationally and formally on progress to the Convention



- Derived from the NAP technical guidelines, the sample process to formulate and implement NAPs represents a typical flow of activities, outputs and outcomes
- The sample NAP process represents a minimum set of steps and building blocks for an effective process, and has been applied on a number of activities:
  - Information paper on how the formulation and implementation of NAPs can be supported
  - Design of training materials for NAP workshops
